The importance of the word **reason** in academic discourse suggested that it might be worth looking at these structures more closely. A rapid concordance of **reason** in the immediate left context of **for** + **V**+**ing** and **to** + **V** showed that there was a strong tendency for the former structure to appear where the reason is named as **specific** (typical determiners being Possessives, **the** and **one**), while the latter structure tended to appear where the reason is named as **non-specific** (typical determiners being **every**, **any** and **no**, together with the Zero determiner):
